Module 1: Civil Law I

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Written examination (120 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have knowledge of the general part of the German Civil Code. They apply legal working methods and use their knowledge in dealing with specific cases. They are able to analyze and solve a simple civil issue from the general part of the German Civil Code with regard to legally relevant aspects. Students recognize the economic relevance of a legal question and can argue the strengths of their solution.

Module 2: Introduction to Law

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Written examination (120 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have an overview of how the legal system works. They know the sources of law and their origins. They have a basic understanding of the functions of law as well as the foundations of the philosophy and ethics of law and are able to apply this understanding to current legal policy and ethical issues. Students are familiar with basic legal terms and are able to apply them in practice. They are sensitized to interactions between the legal, economic and social systems. Students also have a basic understanding of the legal way of thinking and reasoning. They are familiar with the legal working methods and are able to apply them to case studies. They are familiar with the requirements for the formal design of legal academic work. Discussions and exercises in small groups strengthen the students' ability to express themselves in a legal context.

Module examination	Written examination (120 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have basic knowledge of the structure and systematics of public law, as well as the legal assessments on which the regulations are based. They are able to assess situations in the context of public law in writing based on typical cases using legal methodology. Students can argue the strengths of their case solutions with confidence and assess the due exercising of discretion with consideration of the different interests. They are able to assess the effects of public law on decisions by authorities and companies.

Learning outcomes and skills	<p>Students understand the fundamental interrelationships of an economy and economic thinking. By reducing the subject area to important practical issues and using numerous case studies, students are able to apply what they have learned to their economic environment and analyze economic interrelationships. A special focus is placed on competition theory as an important prerequisite for the later Competition Policy module. Students can explain how the market economy works and how economic policy measures are used.</p> <p>Students have the following interdisciplinary skills: Scientific mindset, application of mathematical models, ability to analyze relationships, systematic development of a specialist topic, use of specialist literature and media for professional assessment.</p>

They see the company as a system of procurement, production, sales and financing functions with management accounting developed to manage such a system.</p> <p>Students are familiar with the principles of financial accounting in accordance with statutory regulations, including the principles of double-entry accounting and the corresponding techniques, and they can apply these to business transactions.</p> <p>Students have the following interdisciplinary skills:</p> <p>Complex problem solving through analysis and simulation of the company as a whole. Improved cooperation, communication and conflict resolution skills through an understanding of the interaction between operational sub-areas and their different interests.</p>

They have basic knowledge of EU law and are in a position to apply it to economic situations in the European internal market.</p> <p>Based on their legal knowledge, students are in a position to analyze complex issues and to draw up a differentiated legal opinion and to present the results found convincingly in writing.</p> <p>By discussing current European policy issues and individual cases, they have learned to question their own ideas, to consider alternative cultural, ethical and political perspectives and to make differentiated judgements.</p>

They are also capable of evaluating various financial policies of companies in line with their respective goals.</p> <p>They are familiar with the basics of cost-type, cost-center and cost-unit accounting in the actual and plan versions and can use them in their business decisions.</p> <p>Interdisciplinary skills: Students have the ability to structure and evaluate the fundamentals of financing and investment decisions. They are capable of weighing up and evaluating factors and in the case of uncertainty to make rational decisions.</p>

Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	<p>Students are familiar with the fundamentals and basic terms of criminal law. They have knowledge of commercial criminal law and are able to solve cases relating to commercial criminal law.</p> <p>Students can also assess and question risks that criminal law-relevant behavior entails for the persons and the company involved in the area of commercial criminal law from ethical points of view, such as the protection of creditors and assets or considerations of justice, appropriateness and reasonableness. They can recognize such behavior at the company and react to it adequately. They have an overview of the measures that may be taken by the investigating authorities. Students are familiar with the structure and systematics of public commercial law as well as the evaluations on which the regulations are based; they also have advanced knowledge in important specialist areas.</p> <p>They are able to assess facts of public business law on the basis of typical cases in writing using legal methodology. Students can argue the strengths of their written case solutions with confidence.</p> <p>They have the ability to assess the effects of public commercial law on corporate decisions and to design corporate strategies efficiently and with legal certainty, taking ethical aspects into account.</p>

They can present the solutions found both within the discipline and in an interdisciplinary manner and can argue the strengths of the proposals with confidence.

Learning outcomes and skills	Students master the basics of general tax law and have a thorough overview of relevant questions and problems of special tax law. Students are able to provide solutions to case examples and to present these clearly. In doing so, they make economic decisions taking issues of taxation into account. They also master the most important work methods for expertise in tax law. Students are able to work independently on tax matters on the basis of given specialist literature and to apply the acquired specialist knowledge to selected case studies and to independently clarify open questions within the scope of group work or through pre-formulated questions put to the lecturer.

Learning outcomes and skills	<p>Students are given early career orientation through contact with companies working in specific fields. They apply their theory in practice based on a training plan. This also provides them with valuable occupation-specific knowledge for their further studies and Bachelor thesis.</p> <p>Students test their previously acquired knowledge in a real working environment and recognize the need to deepen their theoretical knowledge. They orientate themselves in the desired professional field and in the practical possibilities for a career as a commercial lawyer. They are adept in the use of modern working methods, such as presentations and team and project work, and they have social and personal skills.</p>

Module 27: Insolvency and Restructuring/Financing and Collateral

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	<p>Students have detailed knowledge of how regular insolvency proceedings work, the rights of the various creditor groups and the effects of the opening of insolvency proceedings on pending contracts. Students understand the economic circumstances that lead to a company's insolvency as well as the economic consequences of insolvency proceedings including reorganization in the insolvency plan procedure. They can develop alternative solutions and argue the strengths of these proposals with confidence, both within the discipline and in an interdisciplinary manner.</p> <p>Students are familiar with the essential structures of equity and debt capital financing including the security rights related thereto. They have the ability to apply this knowledge to real life situations and to solve cases with problems under the law on collateral.</p>

Module 28: Enforcement of Rights

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Portfolio consisting of: 1. Presentation (min. 15, max. 30 min.) with written report (submission period 2 weeks) with 30% weighting 2. Written examination (90 min.) with 70% weighting The examination is passed if at least 50% of the possible number of points has been earned.
Learning outcomes and skills	Students are familiar with the instruments of judicial and extrajudicial enforcement of rights and are able to use these to enforce substantive legal claims and to take these into account when drafting contracts. Students have developed and intensified their ability to draw up arguments and implement these in the discussion on the basis of their advanced knowledge.

Module 29: European and International Business Law

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have in-depth knowledge of the forms and legal framework for the cross-border activities of companies in the European internal market and beyond with a focus on the US. In European business law, the focus is on areas of substantive law such as company law, financial market law, competition law and state aid law. Students have in-depth knowledge of international business law and are also familiar with the legal positions and tasks of states and international organizations as well as with the international trade, international monetary and international financial law shaped by these organizations. In addition to private international law and the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG), including references to law of procedure, the focus is placed on corporate and capital market law of the United States. Students are able to analyze and assess complex international issues, also using English language sources. After critical and comparative examination and evaluation of the various design variants for the internationalization of companies and groups, students are able to make a well-founded decision that they can put forward as a recommendation.

Module 30: Company Management II

ECTS Credits (CP) / Workload (h)	5 / 150
Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have in-depth knowledge of the legal requirements to be observed by the responsible managers (managing directors and board members) when structuring corporate and group organization and when carrying out special transactions. In the field of corporate governance, students have in-depth knowledge of the allocation of authority and responsibility under corporate law, of the interaction between the Management Board and the Supervisory Board as well as of the problems of possible conflicts of interest. They are familiar with the special features of the group and know how to classify the role of the auditor. In the field of mergers and acquisitions, students are familiar with the organizational and liability implications of restructuring, company acquisitions and takeovers. They are in a

	position to implement strategic guidelines with the help of legal instruments and economic calculations and assessments so that they can balance the interests of shareholders and stakeholders to the benefit of all the parties involved.

They have a comprehensive insight into the contents of modern HRM and can evaluate these with regard to sustainable and ethical action. Students also record interesting developments for new solutions to personnel management issues. At the same time, they understand the interrelatedness with organizational issues. Students are familiar with theoretical considerations and practical procedures and are able to work out and evaluate alternative solutions on the basis of case studies. Discussions, presentations and group work allow the students to critically review and compare their own ideas and approaches.

They have the ability to make and justify legally justifiable decisions, taking conflicting interests into account. In addition, students have basic knowledge of social security law. They are in a position to develop and present proposals for solutions to social security issues.

They have the ability to apply theory to complex questions and present their results in writing. They master the methods of legal and economic work. Group work strengthens students' social and working skills. The oral presentation promotes presentation skills. Students also reflect on their results and methods in the discussion in front of the group. They are also able to classify their project topic in the overall context of the main topic and the individual sub-topics.

Module 35: Corporate Management I

Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students are familiar with the legal and economic framework conditions of corporate finance and capital market theory, the legal relationships of companies with banks and other investors as well as the resulting requirements for corporate organization and corporate communication. In corporate financing and capital markets, students master the theory and application of the Modigliani-Miller theorem and the fundamentals of capital market theory. Students are familiar with the most important financial instruments, their availability on the market and their application variants. They can use modern financial theory to economically assess financial decisions. In corporate and financial market communications, students have in-depth knowledge of the company's image in relation to employees, customers, business partners, competitors, investors and supervisory authorities. In addition to the basics of trademark and competition law with special consideration of new media, students also know the strategic importance of the means and signs used for external presentation of companies. Students are able to design, coordinate and implement a coherent financing and communication concept after reviewing and evaluating concrete specifications of a company or group.

Module examination	Written examination (180 min.)
Learning outcomes and skills	Students have an overview of the various methods and instruments of value-oriented corporate management as well as their application and implementation in companies. They pay particular attention to aligning the corporate organization in such a way that liability risks are avoided as much as possible, which initially presupposes knowledge of liability risks for companies themselves, but also for its managers and supervisory board members, and subsequently necessitates developing an existing risk management system into a comprehensive compliance organization. On the whole, students are sensitized to the close connection between corporate management and law as well as to the need for interdisciplinary problem-solving skills.
