European Summerschool – Improving services for aging drug users

We are pleased to tell you about our summerschool, a 3 day training event for health workers working in or planning to establish services for older drug users. The training tackles questions such as; what ethical issues do I encounter when working with the target group?; How can I tailor my project to the needs of older drug users?; How does long-term consumption of illegal drugs affect the aging process? Using innovative training tools, this training allows you to radically rethink health services for aging drug users, and design health interventions in a hands-on way. Health workers are also able visit a drug consumption room at the end of the program and ask questions to drug consumption room professionals.
