Language

Which language did you use? How did you communicate with your fellow students?

I used Spanish during my whole exchange period. I had previous knowledge, I took B2 courses at FUAS before coming to Valencia and during my Erasmus, I took the C1 course at the University's language center.

The city center was 30 minutes away by foot and the beach was also half an hour away by foot. Our landlord was very friendly and whenever we needed something he would drop by to assist us. Overall it was a very nice experience.

I think the best arrival time is the weekend before the semester/classes start.

Living Abroad

The costs are similar to those in Frankfurt. I often used the App Too Good to Go to get cheap deals. There were extra expenses on flights to and from Valencia.

Public transportation isn't included in our semester ticket like in Germany, so every time I'd take the bus/tram/subway I'd have to pay. Also, for the gym and other sports, I had to pay a semester fee and I also paid for the language course.

How would you describe the academic standard of classes compared to Frankfurt?

A lot more challenging.

Did you experience any difference in teaching methods/ class structure? Which were the difference regarding your expectations and your experiences at the partner university?

Yeah, I would say I had more workload in Spain. During the semester we had group work, wrote portfolios and at the end, we still had to take exams. In Germany, I never experienced that after writing paperwork / doing presentations, we would have exams as well.
