**Where have you been accommodated (name of dormitory, location, part of town, etc.)?**

The Hague, street Bazaarlan. The location is situated in the most beautiful part of the Hague, although it isn't the closest possibility to live nearby the university it is definitely worth it. The accommodation is very close to the city center, 5 minutes by foot and 1 minute by tram. In the city center you will find everything from shops to cafes and restaurants. Nearby the Bazaarlan street you will find local restaurants and cozy cafes, which are only known to the local community.

**How far were you able to travel with your semester ticket? How were the libraries? Was their use free? Did the university provide computer workplaces/ computer pools? Was Wi-Fi available on-campus? Did the university provide a sports program? Was this free of charge?**

Food made up the largest part of my expenditure. The semester ticket is great you load it up with money and it will always charge the distances of your trip therefore, you could also use the card for going to close cities like Amsterdam, Rotterdam, etc. My student life was awesome i got to know many people but due to covid most of the gatherings happened in the student accommodations. The food in the Mensa was good and they also provided meat alternative meals for vegetarians and vegans. But it was quite expensive, in Frankfurt I normally paid around 2-3€ and in the Hague i paid normally 5-7€, which made it easier to get food outside the university. The library was great for studying providing various sockets and different computer workplaces. The university itself provided computer workplaces outside

the library, there was Wi-Fi available on the whole campus, there were common rooms for studying or simply for hanging out, study rooms could be rented or used when free. Gym, sport classes...

## **Studying at the Host University**

**How would you describe the academic standard of classes compared to Frankfurt?**

A bit less challenging.

**Did you experience any difference in teaching methods/ class structure? Which were the difference regarding your expectations and your experiences at the partner university?**

The teaching methods were very different one had to do more things during the semester instead of having one big exam at the end of it. In 7 weeks i had 16 assignments, 3 essays, 3 presentations, and 3 exams. The workload was a lot more but the contents were much easier. I expected it to be easier but i didn't expect it to have much bigger workload. Newly arriving students should clarify the workloads of their courses of interest before they apply for a course. I thought i did that but it seems the best way to do this is to send the specific professor an email regarding this issue. Exchange students had a few programs for introducing them to the university and the different procedures. As the organization wasn't really existing, the professors calmed us down because they had as much information as we had (nothing). Nobody knew when things are starting or where to go as well as the online applications (which then were made by one of their system managers for us, which was great).

## **Final Remarks**

**What should future exchange students know/ do/ avoid? How would you overall rate your exchange experience? In what ways have you benefitted academically, personally, linguistically for your future career?**

I improved my communication skills and the skill to adapt to new people and new environments. Future exchange students should expect a no organization of the university and that things change everyday for example one week before arrival they sent us an email saying all courses will be present but as the first day started they were saying most of the courses will be online. As well as many courses changed mid semester which caused so much confusion and the need for planning things differently. I learned a lot about different cultures and about sustainability especially about the circular economy but those credits go to the course minor i attended. My semester abroad will remain unforgettable because I met so many wonderful people and the Hague is a beautiful city especially if you are interested in Art.
